EDUCATION

*Happenings in Institutions & Schemes***EAS MILAP PROGRAMME**

It was a great experience when 27 EAS sponsors came face to face with their wards (numbering 52) on two Sundays (14th and 21st December 2008). The analysis presented at the meeting showed that of 280 students last year, 264 had been sponsored by 80 donors.

193 students were being sponsored by 95 local sponsors, some 9 sponsors from abroad were supporting 66 students between them, while Corpus donation made by 5 sponsors was taking care of 33 other students.

"It was a good initiative. However, I noted that the students need little more privacy and confidentiality to open up. More and frequent meetings may help them to be forthcoming."

Short Term Vocational Courses(STVC), at Dharavi:

Beautician - 5th batch completed on 20th December 2008; while the 11th batch of **Mehndi** got over on 17th Dec. 2008.

Sewing Classes: Both batches of 20 students each will complete their courses by December, 2008.

MES Vocational Training Centre has 29 girls are attending the **Beautician's** course, while another 34 boys are attending the **Electrician's** course; 21 have enrolled for the **English Speaking Course**.

Nursery Schools:

Children's Day celebrated in all Nursery schools on 14th November. Poetry and nursery rhymes recitation (non-competitive) was held at Little Toddlers and Little Fairies (Jogeshwari) on 30th November, 2008. A DVD player with speaker was donated by Dr. Yasmeen Pathan, parent of our Little Angel's School, Malad (East).

MEDICAL

In this quarter (October- December) 50 HCMA cases were sanctioned and 113 cases under GMA were provided help and Rs.63203/- worth TB medicines were given to 11 patients.

Dialysis cases - 10 patients completed their 6 months dialyses in December and another 6 patients have been taken.

Mobile Clinic: During the current quarter (Oct.- Dec.08), between the two Mobile Clinics (the one located at Kausa, became functional from 1st December, 2008). We have treated 5512 patients in 70 working days, an average of almost 80 patients per day through the first mobile clinic.

We have to thank Dr.R.Sumar & his colleagues (Trustees) of Muslim Ambulance Society for allowing use of their Ambulance when our Mobile Clinic had been away for servicing from 9th to 20th September.

We are grateful to Ms. Nisrin Ebrahim, Trustee of Rangoonwala Foundation (India Chapter) for organizing a very well attended workshop on "Scenario of increasing cost of health care and the shrinking provision of govt. facilities".

POVERTY RELIEF

Clothes Distribution : 9,725 clothes were handed over to Goonj on 7-11-2008 on reciprocal basis.

Around 5,000 clothes were distributed on 11th October 2008 at Malawani, Malad from the premises of St. Paul's School.

8 Cases of **House Repair** sanctioned in the last three months at a cost of Rs.1,85,000/-

Qurbani Packets' Distribution: 693 Qurbani meat packets were distributed to families in different locations in Mumbai out of funds received from Muslim Aid, UK.

Ration Distribution : Currently there are 144 beneficiary families, most of whom are widows, divorcees and deserted women's families; 18 cases are awaiting being sponsored.

Sewing Machines: 21 given out so far during first distribution. 2nd distribution would be held in February 2009.

2nd Mobile Clinic donated by Valli Charitable Trust, was inaugurated at Kausa, on 30th November, 2008, by Dr. Ramesh Bharmal, Dean of Rajiv Gandhi Medical College & Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Hospital, Kalwa.

MY EXPERIENCE OF THE FIELD

The other side of Mumbai, commercial capital of India

When I went last month to pay a home visit in response to a case for Ration Support, tears came to my eyes. I immediately thanked Allah for what He has given me; I immediately asked forgiveness for my complaints to Him.

The applicant Zaitoon*, a widow staying with her three young daughters and her mother, who is nearing 80 years of age. Her house is a kuchha hutment, the Municipal authorities have demolished it many times; but she has nowhere to go and continues to stay there, with no roof and partial partitions for walls.

She is a hawker selling vegetables door to door; each day she buys a bundle of vegetables (some good and some rotten) at a cheaper rate from Dadar market; she then segregates the good and throws the bad ones, spending quite some time on this. She then goes on her round door to door and manages to make Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- from this each day.

When I went with her for the first time after she was inducted in MESCO's Ration Support programme to make the ration purchases for the month from the grocery shop which included 13 kg rice, 13 kg wheat, 3.5 kg dal, 3.5 sugar 500 gm tea powder, 600 gm masala, 1.5 kg ghee, 2.5 litres cooking oil, 15 litres milk; she was astonished to see the package. When I handed over the items to her she started weeping incessantly; she had never seen so much quantity of food grains for her family in her entire life; she just used to purchase day to day minimum requirement from the meager income she earned and could never imagine purchasing food in bulk quantity at any point of time.

Allah alone knows how many such Zaitoons are surviving in our world class city!
